III At times when clouds are
in the sky, one may see
images that do not exist. In Act 3 when Banquo

is haunting Macbeth he says, "Can such things - cloud"
In the summertime there are only supposed to be sunny

days but in the context Macbeth uses it here he feels he is seeing something crazy. He doesn't believe Banquo's ghost come to haunt as a cloud comes out of nowhere in the summation.

P¹⁵ Hecate is the head witch who plans on making Macbeth hubris. In Act 3 scene 5 she says, "My little spirit, see, sits in a foggy cloud ^{and} stays for me" - This means that Hecate has a ^{foreknowledge} that follows her where she goes. She will use her words to equivocate to Macbeth. She gives him what he wants to hear but not all of the truth, therefore clouding his judgement. When Macbeth described the witches he said, "infected be the air they walk on!" This is ^{similar to Hecate's fog} ~~the same~~ ^{to} when the witches travel they leave behind a smoky, cloudy ^{The} ~~of~~ witches have also been clouding Macbeth's which leads to his downfall. Later on when Macbeth's plans don't work out he curses the witches.

P¹⁶ Shakespeare also uses clouds to connect to ^{the} ~~the~~ wider theme ^{that nothing} ~~is what it seems~~ is what it seems, from the beginning of the "Fair is foul and foul is fair" you will see the line right after says, "Hail through the fog and filthy air."
