Lessons Learned in Assessing International Learning

1. Demonstrates knowledge of global issues, processes, trends and systems.
2. Demonstrates knowledge of other cultures.
3. Understands his/her culture in a global and comparative context.
4. Uses knowledge, diverse cultural frames of reference, and alternate perspectives to think critically and solve problems.
5. Uses foreign language skills and/or knowledge of other cultures to extend his/her access to information, experiences, and understanding.
6. Communicates and connects with people in other language communities in a range of settings for a variety of purposes, developing skills in each of the four modalities: speaking (productive), listening (receptive), reading (receptive), writing (productive).
7. Demonstrates a willingness to seek out international or intercultural opportunities.
8. Appreciates different cultures (e.g., language, art, music, religion, political structures, philosophy, and material culture).
9. Accepts cultural differences and tolerates cultural ambiguity.
